INTRODUCTION

- Many public nonprofits rely on volunteers
- Diverse volunteer workforce important in making clients feel welcome and providing different perspectives
- Evaluation requested by large San Diego non-profit whose volunteer program lacks diversity to understand if problem with recruitment, retention, or both

OBJECTIVES

- Evaluate applicant and active volunteer diversity
- Assess opinions on diversity within the program among volunteers from underrepresented groups
- Identify successful strategies used by similar nonprofits for recruitment and retention of diverse volunteers

METHODS

- Data from program's volunteer database (n=4688) used to compare sociodemographic characteristics of applicants and current volunteers with SD county population
- Mapped residence by area deprivation index (ADI)
- Interviewed 12 active volunteers & four volunteer coordinators at similar nonprofits
- Interviews transcribed, themes identified, and text coded

RESULTS

Quantitative findings

- Applicants more likely to be female, older, and have higher education than SD county population
- Socioeconomically disadvantaged areas underrepresented
- Those who become active volunteers even less representative of the population

Recommendations from qualitative interviews:

- Engage in outreach to minority communities & increase advertisement of the program
- Partner with community leaders/organizations & implement paid internships for students from underrepresented communities

CONCLUSIONS/POLICY IMPLICATIONS

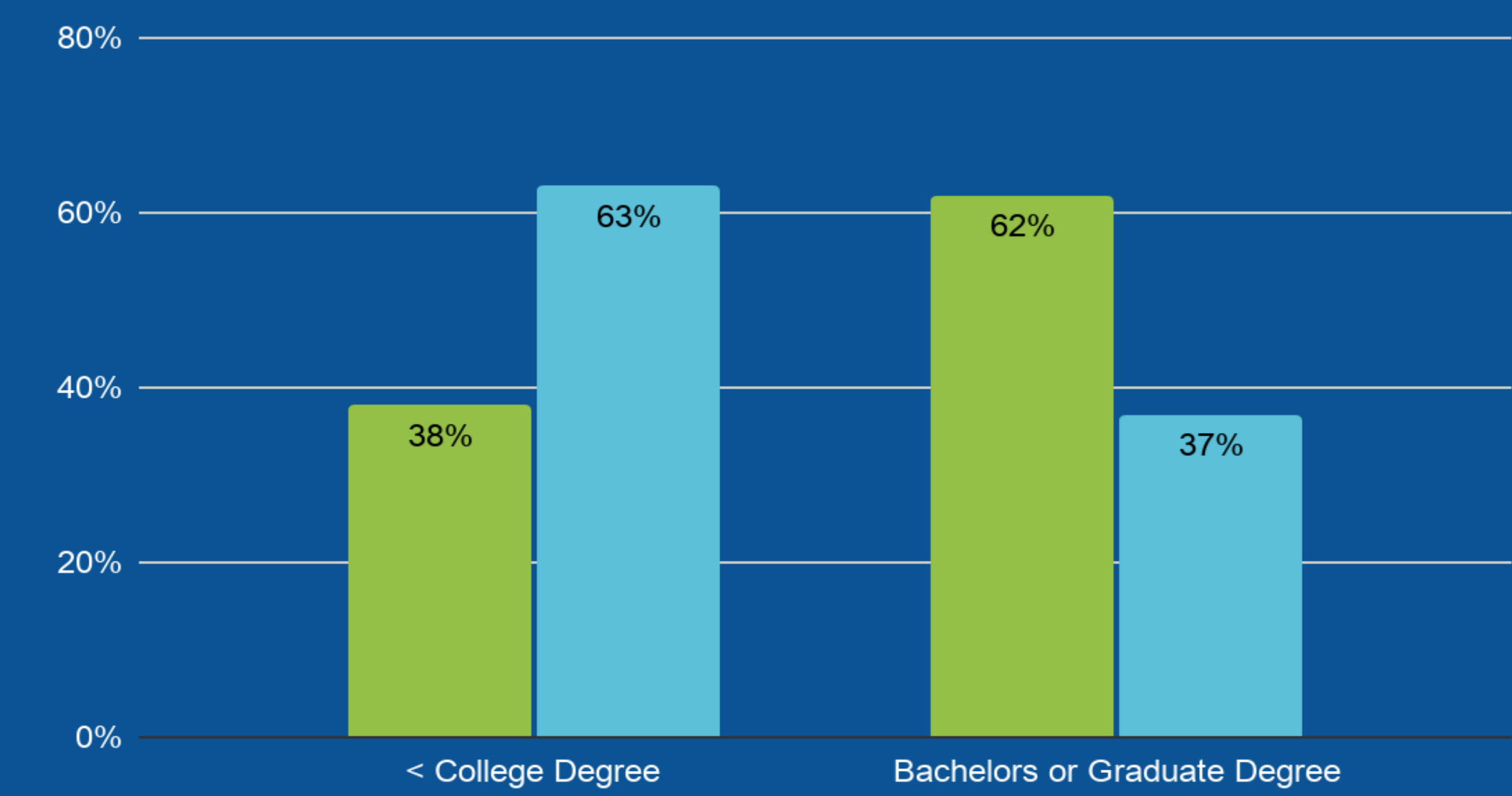
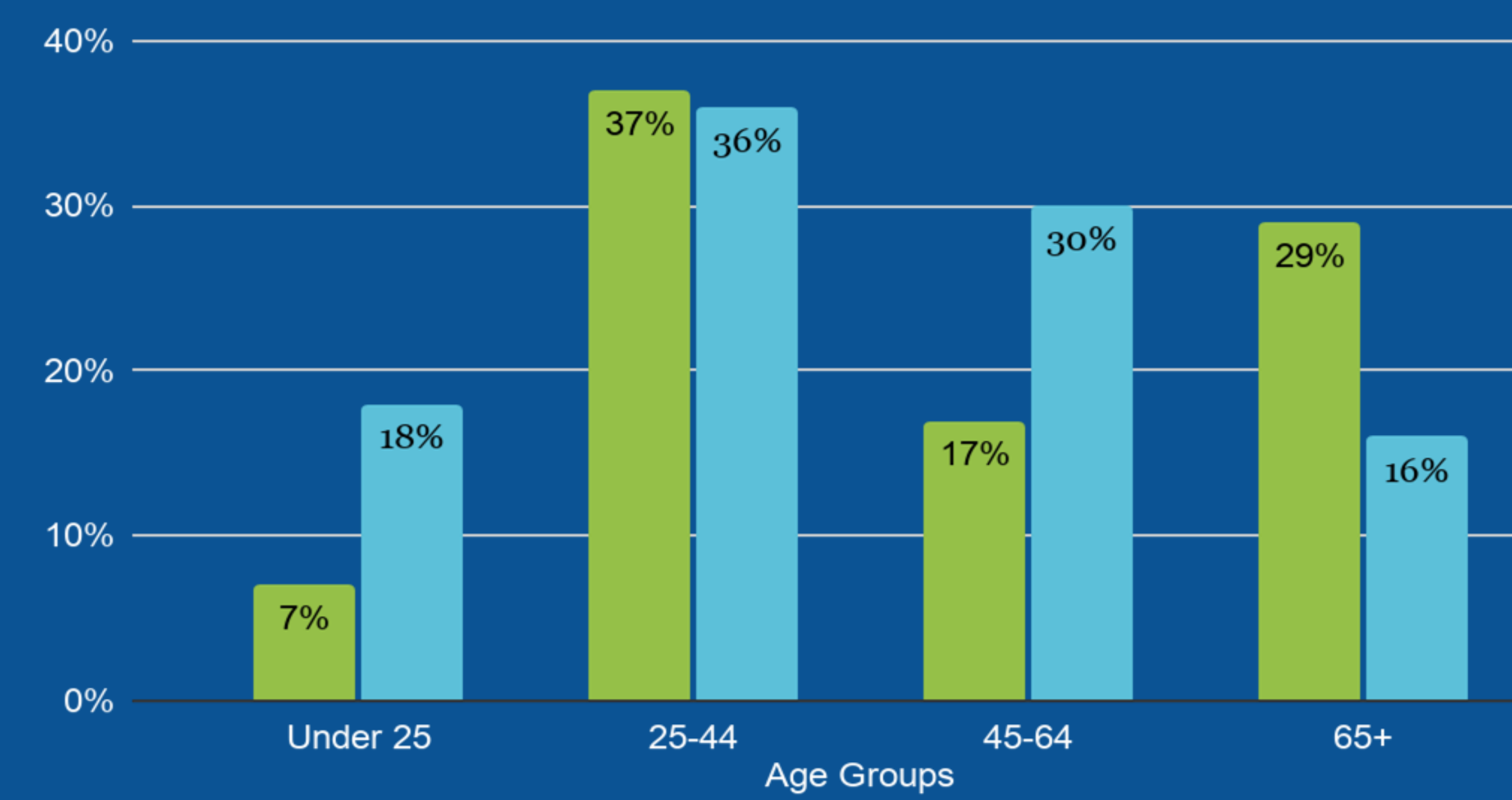
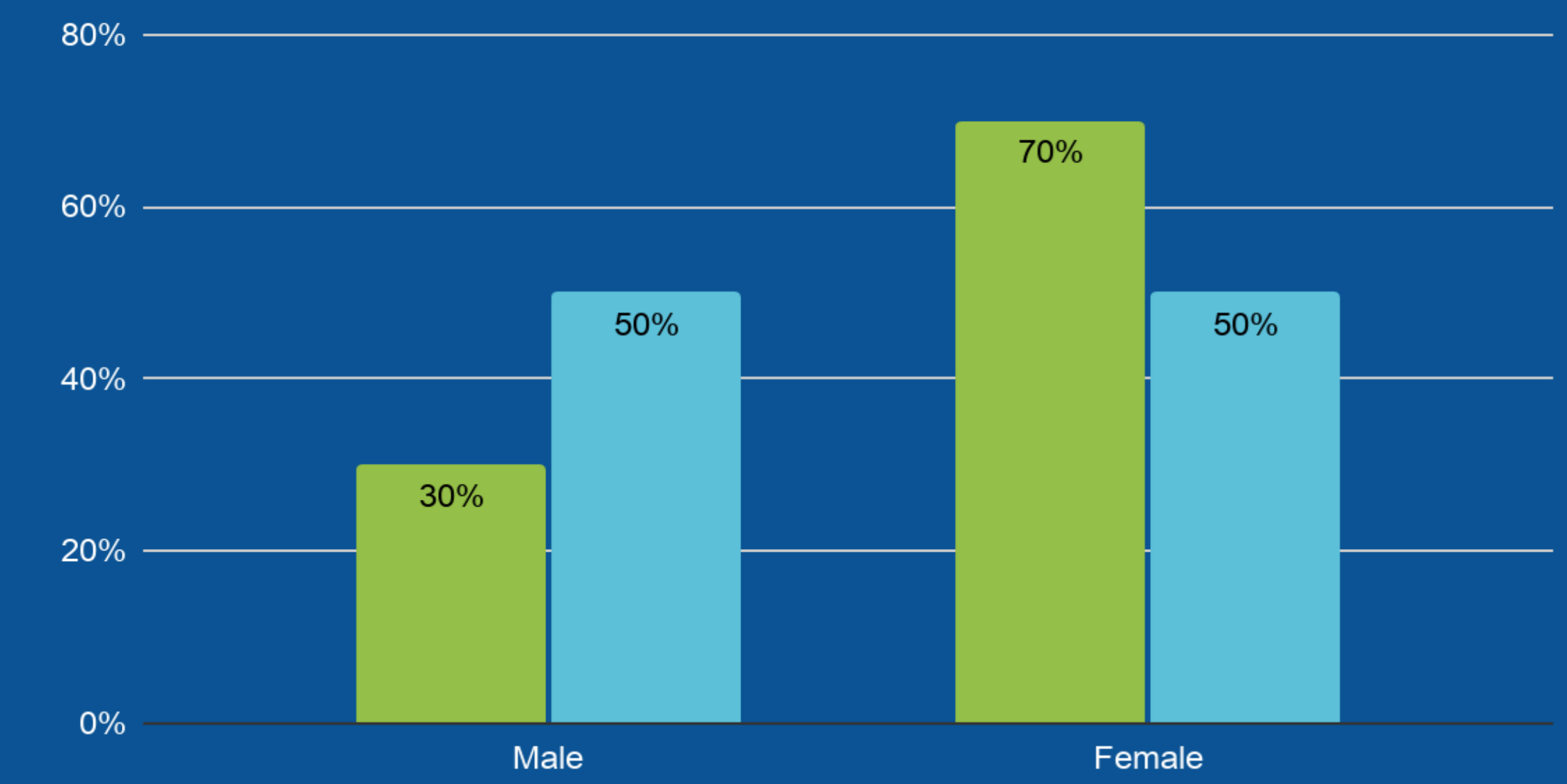
- Diversity throughout entire program is limited
- Increasing community outreach and decreasing strict volunteer requirements may improve diversity



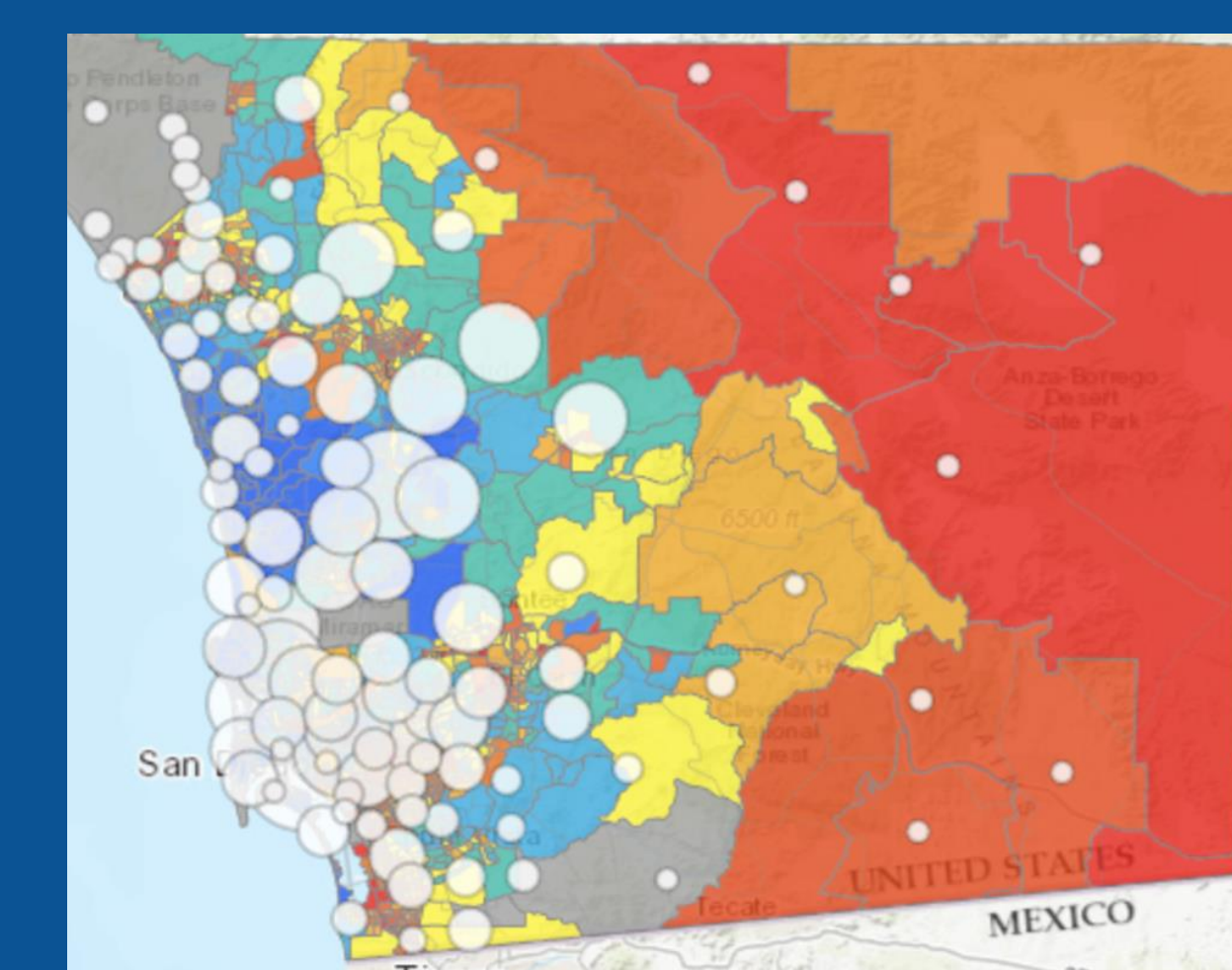
