Dear Current and Prospective Public Health Majors:

PLEASE, PLEASE, PLEASE READ THIS ENTIRE EMAIL!!!

We realize that this is a long email, but it is extremely important. It contains instructions that are critical to registering for SPRING 2025 PH classes.

As you may know, registration is just around the corner. The Schedule of Classes will post on **February 7th** and registration begins the following week. Due to high demand for our courses, we have reserved a number of seats in our PH classes to help ensure that students graduate on time. This means that if you want to take one or more PH courses in SPRING 2025, you will need to follow the instructions listed below.

It is <u>VERY</u> IMPORTANT that you check your <u>VAC</u> and UCSD email regularly. The department will be sending out time-sensitive updates. If you miss these updates, you may end up not getting seats in classes you need.

INSTRUCTIONS:

Please check out our <u>Advising Calendar</u> for up-to-date advising availability. Only drop-in advising and group advising is available in during registration so that the advisors are available to all public health students who have scheduling questions. If you are unable to come in during zoom drop-in advising hours, please send any questions you have through the <u>VAC</u>. <u>Queries received via phone or email will not receive a response</u>.

NOTE REGARDING ALL PH COURSES:

If you are interested in enrolling in a PH course that is full during your first pass, you should waitlist at the very beginning of second pass. The campus waitlist will be prioritized, and the department will keep an internal waitlist. All remaining seats will be filled using the internal waitlist, so please make sure to waitlist at the very beginning of second pass and wait for our VAC message before switching your schedule. We will message all waitlisted students to let them know if we have seats for them or if we have placed them on our internal waitlist for the course within 2 weeks after second pass has started. All students who were authorized to enroll in a PH course MUST enroll in first pass for priority enrollment.

- SP25 PH Course with first pass Preauthorization: PH 130

All students who will not have completed PH 130 by the end of WI25 and are enrolled in PH 193, PH 194, or PH 196AH this winter have been cleared to enroll in PH 130 for SP25 first pass.

REMINDER REGARDING PH 193/194 CAPSTONE PREREQUISISTES:

Completion of PH 40, PH 101, PH 102, PH 110, and PH 120 is required prior to enrollment in PH 193. The BSPH Program is not able to make any exceptions and allow a student to complete any of the above prerequisite courses concurrently with PH 193.

- One section of PH 193/194 in FA24/WI25 and in FA25/WI26
- All remaining sections of PH 193/194 in WI25/SP25 and in WI26/SP26

IN-PERSON VERSUS REMOTE PH INSTRUCTION:

All PH courses will be in-person for Spring 2025, we will not be offering any remote or asynchronous instruction options. Courses that offer an in-person option will indicate a campus classroom. All remote courses will list RCLAS indicating the course will be taught remotely.

PH COURSE DETAILS & INFORMATION

PH 45: Tuesday/Thursday 5-6:20pm; Discussion W 9-9:50am or 10-10:50am with Dr. Stone Prerequisites: PH 40. Open to FR, SO, JR standing. Students with SR Standing must submit an <u>Enrollment Authorization System (EASy)</u> to enroll.

- Number of seats being released for open registration: **60** (any remaining seats after released seats have filled will first be prioritized for declared Public Health Majors)
- NOTE: This course requirement is <u>ONLY</u> for students who entered UCSD in FA24. Please do not enroll in this course if you entered UCSD prior to FA24. FA24 entering students are also able to take COGS 14A, PSYC 70, or SOCI 60 to fulfill this requirement (special exception for the 2024-2025 year only). All students interested in enrolling should waitlist at the very beginning of second pass if the class is full.

PH 50: Tuesday/Thursday 8-9:20am; with Dr. Glockner

Prerequisites: None. Open to FR, SO, JR standing. Students with SR Standing must submit an <u>Enrollment</u> Authorization System (EASy) to enroll.

- Number of seats being released for open registration: **300** (any remaining seats after released seats have filled will first be prioritized for declared Public Health Majors)
- NOTE: All students interested in enrolling should waitlist at the very beginning of second pass if the class is full.

PH 95: Wednesday 11-11:50am with Dr. Larsen (Teaching Instructors are the Healthbeat Advisors, Ron and Jade) PH 95: Medical School Prep 101 Application (MUST attach with EASy Request)

Prerequisites: Open to all students who entered UCSD in FA24 - First-year freshmen students and first-year transfer students. All other students are not eligible.

This course is designed for first-year freshmen students and first-year transfer students who are interested in pursuing medicine and becoming physicians. Learn what it takes to prepare for medical school as well as what it takes to be a competitive applicant. We'll cover everything from academic requirements, timeline, and MCAT to obtaining relevant experiences (i.e. healthcare, service, leadership, and research), letters of evaluation, the 15 core competencies and more.

PH 101: Tuesday/Thursday 9:30-11:50am with Dr. Tan

Prerequisites: PH 40, PSYC 60 or MATH 11 or COGS 14B or HDS 60. Open to JR, SR standing. Students with SO Standing must submit an <u>Enrollment Authorization System (EASy)</u> to enroll.

- Number of seats being released for open registration: **50** (any remaining seats after released seats have filled will first be prioritized for declared Public Health Majors)
- IMPORTANT: If you are planning on graduating in 2026 and have not yet completed one of the following: PH 101 or PH 102, you MUST enroll in either PH 101 or PH 102 in SPRING 2025. If you have problems getting into PH 101 or PH 102 during your first pass, please send the department a VAC message ASAP to let us know before your first pass has ended.
- NOTE: All students interested in enrolling should waitlist at the very beginning of second pass if the class is full.
- REMINDER: We do not recommend students enroll in both PH 101 and PH 102 in the same quarter.

PH 102: Tuesday/Thursday 2-3:20pm; Lab F 9-9:50am or 10-10:50am with Dr. Rana PH 102: Tuesday/Thursday 3:30-4:50pm; Lab F 11-11:50am or 12-12:50pm with Dr. Rana

Prerequisites: PH 40, PSYC 60 or MATH 11 or COGS 14B or HDS 60. Open to JR, SR standing. Students with SO Standing must submit an <u>Enrollment Authorization System (EASy)</u> to enroll.

- Number of seats being released for open registration: **100** (any remaining seats after released seats have filled will first be prioritized for declared Public Health Majors)
- IMPORTANT: If you are planning on graduating in 2026 and have not yet completed one of the following: PH 101 or PH 102, you MUST enroll in either PH 101 or PH 102 in SPRING 2025. If you have problems getting into PH 101 or PH 102 during your first pass, please send the department a VAC message ASAP to let us know before your first pass has ended.
- NOTE: All students interested in enrolling should waitlist at the very beginning of second pass if the class is full.
- REMINDER: We do not recommend students enroll in both PH 101 and PH 102 in the same quarter.

PH 110: Tuesday/Thursday: 8-9:20am with Dr. Campbell

PH 110: Tuesday/Thursday: 9:30-10:50am with Dr. Zoumas

Prerequisites: PH 40. Open to SO, JR, SR standing.

- Number of seats being released for open registration: **110** (any remaining seats after released seats have filled will first be prioritized for declared Public Health Majors)
- NOTE: All students interested in enrolling should waitlist at the very beginning of second pass if the class is full.

PH 120: Tuesday/Thursday 2-3:20pm with Dr. Wynn

Prerequisites: PH 40. Open to JR, SR standing. Students with SO Standing must submit an <u>Enrollment Authorization System (EASy)</u> to enroll.

- Number of seats being released for open registration: **60** (any remaining seats after released seats have filled will first be prioritized for declared Public Health Majors)
- NOTE: All students interested in enrolling should waitlist at the very beginning of second pass if the class is full.

PH 130: Monday/Wednesday 11-12:20pm with Dr. Gould

Prerequisites: PH 40, PH 101. Open to JR, SR standing.

- Number of seats being released for open registration: **50** (any remaining seats after released seats have filled will first be prioritized for declared Public Health Majors)
- NOTE: All students interested in enrolling should waitlist at the very beginning of second pass if the class is full.

PH 155: Tuesday/Thursday 12:30-1:50pm with Dr. Fielding-Miller

Prerequisites: PH 40. Open to SO, JR, SR standing.

- Number of seats being released for open registration: **70** (any remaining seats after released seats have filled will first be prioritized for declared Public Health Majors)
- NOTE: All students interested in enrolling should waitlist at the very beginning of second pass if the class is full
- REMINDER: This course fulfills 1 PH UDE major requirement.

PH 162: Tuesday/Thursday 3:30-4:50pm with Dr. Eikey

Prerequisites: PH 40. Open to SO, JR, SR standing.

- Number of seats being released for open registration: **30** (any remaining seats after released seats have filled will first be prioritized for declared Public Health Majors)
- NOTE: All students interested in enrolling should waitlist at the very beginning of second pass if the class is full.
- REMINDER: This course fulfills 1 PH UDE major requirement.

PH 194 (Public Health Capstone II): Various days/times with Dr. Marquez, Dr. Nguyen, Dr. White, Dr. Zoumas This class is only for students who will have minimally completed PH 40, PH 101, PH 102, PH 110, PH 120, and PH 193 prior to SP25. Students enrolled in PH 193 will be able to enroll in the same PH 194 section day/time and instructor once winter grades have posted. Every student enrolled in PH 193 this winter will have a seat in PH 194 as long as a C- or higher grade in PH 193 is earned. As a reminder all Capstone students are required to attend their PH 194 final exam Poster Session in-person, there are no exceptions. Please see below for attendance policy for the course and Poster Showcase.

PH 196BH (Public Health Honors Practicum): Tuesday/Thursday 12:30-1:50pm with Dr. Binkin Students who have applied and were accepted into this year's Honors Practicum will be cleared to enroll once winter grades have posted.

BSPH Program Policy on Maximum Number of Absences (PH 193/194 and PH 196AH/BH)

The BSPH Program policy includes that students must attend a minimum of 80% of each Capstone course in the sequence or the Honors Practicum sequence. Students will not pass PH 193/194 or PH 196AH/BH if they miss >20% of classes (for any reason). Regardless of a student's earned grade, any student who has missed more than the allowed number of absences (excused or unexcused) will fail the course and need to retake the course in a future quarter.

PH 194/PH 196BH Final: Poster Showcase Presentation

The final for PH 194 and PH 196BH is an in-person poster presentation of the Capstone project or Honors Practicum project at the Poster Showcase. The Poster Showcase is the final step in students culminating research project. It is designed to give students an in-person experience of sharing and discussing work with peers and faculty the same way that is expected of many public health professionals. It is an essential step in preparation for a career in the field of public health and a required final event of this PH 194 Capstone course and the PH 196BH course. Attendance to this event is mandatory for all students to pass the course. Students failing to attend will be required to retake the course in a future quarter. The final requirement of participating in the Poster Showcase is not merely a formality but a pivotal component of the students' comprehensive research experience. It is crafted to provide a realistic experience that mirrors the professional expectations placed upon public health professionals. Engaging in this forum allows students to convey and deliberate over their findings with both peers and faculty, fostering a collaborative and scholarly environment. This Poster Showcase is indispensable in the academic and professional journey within the public health sphere. It equips students with the vital skills of communication, critical feedback reception, and networking, which are cornerstone abilities in the field. Moreover, it prepares them for the real-world scenario where sharing and defending their research findings is a common practice among public health professionals. The presentation and subsequent question-and-answer session are designed to simulate the professional conferences and symposiums where experts convene to exchange ideas and advance public health knowledge.

FINAL ITEMS:

Lastly, we recognize that our advising hours will be limited prior to spring enrollment. However, we will also be available on the <u>VAC</u> to answer questions. Please contact us ASAP with any registration questions you may have prior to Friday, February 7th to ensure that your questions are answered in time for first pass registration.
